

Hawarden Public Library Wireless Internet Policy

The Hawarden Public Library offers wireless connections to the library's internet service. If you are bringing your own laptop, tablet, or phone, you are able to use the library's internet connection, if you have the following:

- a wireless network interface card, 802.11b or later
- the ability to configure your device to use the library's internet connection
- compatible headphones if you plan to use audio

PLEASE NOTE: Library staff CANNOT assist you with your laptop, card, or configuration. The Library CANNOT accept the liability of handling any of your equipment.

Remember:

The internet/personal computer use policy of the Hawarden library applies to all wireless devices in the library. (Policy is posted in the computer room.)

Unfiltered, wireless internet access is provided FREE of charge to anyone using their personal device or laptop that is equipped with functioning wireless or a wired network connection.

If using audio, headphones are required and are not furnished by the library.

Printing is NOT available on the library's wireless network.

Users do not need to be a library card holder to use the system.

Regular library computer time limits do not apply to wireless access use.

The library assumes no responsibility for a wireless user's equipment or software and cannot guarantee the security of an individual's files or transmissions.

Remember, library staff will not provide technical assistance to wireless users.

Wireless Internet access may not be used for unauthorized, illegal or unethical purposes. No one may send, receive or display text or graphics that may reasonably be construed as obscene or violent.

Just a reminder, the library's wireless network is open and not deemed secure. Information sent from your laptop could be captured by someone else with a wireless device and the appropriate software.

The library assumes no responsibility for the safety of equipment or for configurations, security, or data files resulting from connection to the library's wireless network.

You may encounter "dead"spots or areas of lessened transmission. If this happens, try another location in the library. Wireless service is provided during regular library hours.

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
